WHEREAS, Professor Lisa Lee has served with distinction as a full time faculty member of Coastline Community College since 2001, was elected Coastline's "Teacher of the Year" in 2007, and was nominated as the community college nominee for the Orange County Teacher of the Year in 2008; and

WHEREAS, Professor Lisa Lee has served on the Coastline Community College Academic Senate and committees for Academic Rank and Recognition, Research, Academic Standards, Technology and Distance Learning, and has served as a member of the Coastline College President's Circle; and

WHEREAS, Professor Lisa Lee serves as the content expert for the Coastline Community College's "Introduction to Statistics" course for Coast Learning Systems, and has presented several scholarly research papers at national mathematics conferences; and

WHEREAS, since 1989, the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD), awards, annually, the NISOD Excellence Awards in conjunction with its annual International Conference on Teaching and Leadership Excellence, with the awards acknowledging faculty members who have demonstrated excellence in instruction, scholarship and leadership; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development has awarded a 2008 NISOD Excellence Award to Professor Lisa Lee, for her distinguished teaching, service to students, scholarship, and commitment to leadership in the classroom;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Coast Community College District Board of Trustees, on this Second Day of April, Two Thousand and Eight, hereby recognizes Professor Lisa Lee for receiving a NISOD Excellence Award and for her many outstanding contributions to Coastline College, its students, and the community she serves.

7. Public Hearing - Coast Community College Association/California Teachers Association-National Educators Association's (Coast CCA/CTA-NEA) Initial Proposal to Reopen Negotiations between the Coast CCA/CTA-NEA and the Coast Community College District

It is recommended by the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor for Human Resources that the Board of Trustees, in compliance with the necessary PERB legal procedures, provide for an opportunity for any public comment on the proposal made by the Coast Community College Association/California Teachers Association-National Educators Association (Coast CCA/CTA-NEA) on March 5, 2008 to reopen negotiations between the Coast Community College Association/California Teachers Association-National Educators Association (Coast CCA/CTA-NEA) and the Coast Community College District for the following:

The Coast Community College Association/California teachers Association-National Educators Association (Coast CCA/CTA-NEA) and the Coast Community College District agree to extend the current collective bargaining agreement between the District and the Union through June 30, 2010, with two reopeners in the 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 school years. In the 2009–2010 school year the entire contract will be reopened.

Pursuant to section 3527 of the Government Code and in compliance with the current collective bargaining agreement between the parties, the Union hereby exercises its rights to reopen on the following articles for 2008 - 09 school year:

ARTICLE IV – ASSOCIATION RIGHTS

Section 8. Miscellaneous Compensation

The Union proposes the language in Section 8 be amended to read as follows:

"The Association shall be granted one two hundred (100) (200) hours per semester at the prevailing miscellaneous instruction rate to perform official representational duties."

ARTICLE XIV - PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Union proposes that the language in this article be amended to read as follows:

Item 7 continued, Public Hearing - Coast Community College Association/California Teachers Association-National Educators Association's (Coast CCA/CTA-NEA) Initial Proposal to Reopen Negotiations between the Coast CCA/CTA-NEA and the Coast Community College District

- (a) The District shall create a Professional Development Fund *in the District budget* for Unit Members of \$11,000.00 \$15,000 per semester. The fund will be allocated to the Colleges based on the number of Unit Members employed during the preceding semester. Unit Members may apply for a stipend, subject to the limitations of overall funding, of up to \$100, at the usual non-instructional rate to attend a District/College sponsored workshop of two hours or more, or up to \$700 for registration and reasonable approved expenses for travel and lodging for a non-District sponsored conference. Approved attendance at such professional development activities will include compensation for any class time missed because of such conference/workshop attendance.
- (b) Applications for Professional Development will be considered on a first come first-served basis with a limit of two applications per person/per semester. With the appropriate Dean's approval, They applications will be made through the Association to the Office of the Vice-President of Instruction of the Unit Member's College. The Office of the Vice-President of Instruction for each College shall disseminate information to all Unit Members of scheduled workshops and conferences and the deadline for such application. A brief report will be required of attendees at non-District sponsored conferences/workshops.
- (c) At the end of each academic year, the Vice President of Instruction <u>District travel office</u> shall forward to the Association a copy of the year-end Professional Development Fund expenditures. The report will contain a detailed listing of Unit Members receiving funds and include beginning and ending account balances. <u>Any ending balances shall be carried over to the next school year.</u>

It is recommended by the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor for Human Resources that the Board of Trustees, in compliance with the necessary PERB legal procedures, provide for an opportunity for any public comment on the proposal made by the Coast Community College District on March 5, 2008 not to exercise its option to reopen any articles during the negotiations process between the Coast Community College District and the Coast Community College Association/California Teachers Association-National Educators Association (Coast CCA/CTA-NEA). 12. Opportunity for Board of Trustees' Discussion of Alternative Agenda Formats

At the Board of Trustees' Retreat on February 26, 2008, by unanimous consent of the Board, a committee was formed consisting of the Board President and Immediate Past President of the Board to analyze the Board's Agenda and to make recommendations that would streamline the format and length of the Agenda. After review by the committee, the Chancellor, and in consultation with the Orange County Department of Education General Counsel, the committee recommends that the Board adopt two meeting formats.

Agenda template "B" is the "Business Meeting" format. When only one Board meeting occurs in a month, the President of the Board of Trustees, in consultation with the Chancellor, shall decide which template to be utilized, given priorities at the time. A revised template for Closed Session is also attached for Trustees' consideration.

The Board meeting on May 7 will be set as a "Business Meeting." The Board meeting on May 21 will be a "Study Session" workshop focusing on the "District Agenda."

This course furthers the student's skills in electric vehicle (EV) conversions and provides an introduction to advanced EV designs and propulsion systems. The students will work with hybrids, fuel cells & alternating current (A/C) drive systems in advanced design electric vehicles. The course includes: EV design and construction; the testing, assembly, operation and maintenance of EVs; the

influence of aerodynamic design; advanced technology batteries and intelligent charging systems; hydrogen fuel cell technology and alternative EV drive systems. Appropriate safety related instruction will be included in each segment. This course may be taken three times.

Computer Business Applications G149 – Outlook

F 08 2.0 units

Semester length; 27 lecture and 27 non-lecture semester hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: student option. Students will learn to use and customize Outlook, a personal information manager and e-mail program. Students will use Outlook to manage schedules, store information about contacts, keep track of tasks to be completed, and send and receive e-mail messages. Students will use Outlook to organize work in order to automatically prepare task lists, share calendars and schedules with others, and ensure data remains safe and under control. Students will also explore using Outlook to integrate with other technologies such as Project, OneNote, SharePoint Services, Mobile Service, and Really Simple Syndication (RSS) feeds and blogs. This course may be taken four times.

Computer Business Applications G183 – Office, Intermediate

F 08 4.0 units

Semester length; 54 lecture and 54 non-lecture semester hours; Advisory: Computer Business Applications G181 or equivalent; fee: none; grading method: student option. Students will learn computer business applications used in today's businesses using advanced features of the Office Suite to create, edit, and format various business documents. Students will learn how to create, format, and modify documents using Word; create and modify spreadsheets and analyze data using Excel; create and report information using Access; and create, enhance, and deliver professional presentations using PowerPoint. This course may be taken four times.

Criminal Justice G152 – Probation and Corrections: Case Planning and Supervision F 08

Semester length; 54 semester lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: letter grade. This course provides a comprehensive introduction to effective case planning, supervision, and intervention techniques for probation and corrections officers working with adult and juvenile criminal offenders. This course offers the student a practical introduction to a career as a probation, parole, or

corrections officer.

ESL Writing Center G011 – Present and Present Progressive Tense Skills

F 08 0.25 units

3.0 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course focuses on the correct usage of Present and Present Progressive Tense Verbs. Students will learn when to use these tenses, how to ask questions and give answers, how and when to use contractions, how to form wh-questions, how to form the negative, and how to use the verb "be."

ESL Writing Center G012 – Simple Future Tense

7 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course provides study of simple future tense in English, focusing on WILL + verb and BE GOING TO + verb.

ESL Writing Center G013 – Past and Past Progressive Tense Skills Dev.

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course focuses on the correct usage of verbs in the Past and Past Progressive tenses to describe events and situations. The review lessons and exercises include time-frame shifts signaled by time marker expressions that indicate the correct tense. Students will also review the rules to formulate yes/no and why-questions, negative sentences, and their corresponding answers.

ESL Writing Center G015 – Past Habit – "Used To"

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course focuses on the correct usage of "Used To" to talk about past habits or past situations that no longer exist in the present. Students will learn to contrast the past and the present using "used to" and time expressions. The lessons include learning to ask and answer yes/no and wh-questions, form negative sentences, and differentiate between "used to" and used to + base form of the verb versus "be used to" (be accustomed to).

ESL Writing Center G025 – Sentence Combining Introduction

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course is a study of introductory sentence combining in written English, focusing on coordinating conjunctions and simple adverb clauses of time, contrast, and cause and effect.

ESL Writing Center G026 – Prepositions, Introduction to

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course provides an introductory study of prepositions used in written English, focusing on prepositions of place and time.

ESL Writing Center G027 – Spelling, Introduction to

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course focuses on basic spelling rules which help students to use sounds to spell correctly.

ESL Writing Center G044 – Modal Auxiliaries, The formation and use of

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course focuses on the correct usage of Modals. Students will learn what modals are, how to form them, and where they are used.

ESL Writing Center G054 – Passive Voice Skills Development

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course focuses on the correct usage of the Passive Voice. Students will learn how to form the passive, when to use it, how to use the passive in different tenses and with modals, and the use of the "by-phrase."

ESL Writing Center G055 – Formation and Use of Participial Adjectives

08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This course is designed to give students a review of the adjective formation in English, with special focus on Participial Adjectives and to provide guided practice in using them in writing.

ESL Writing Center G056 – Present Perfect

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This class focuses on the usage of the present perfect forms and their applications in writing.

ESL Writing Center G057 – Present Perfect Progressive

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. Review of the present perfect progressive tense, both form and applications.

ESL Writing Center G058 – Past Perfect

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This class focuses on the usage of the past perfect forms and their application in writing.

ESL Writing Center G059 – Past Perfect Progressive

F 08 0.25 units

Semester length; 9 semester non-lecture hours; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading method: credit/no credit. This class focuses on the usage of the past perfect progressive forms and their applications.

Computer Information Systems A117 – Computing Tools for Today's Student

08 2.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 2.0Lec/1.0 Lab; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading: graded. Instruction and practice in using current and upcoming technology to succeed as a student. Focus on software and hardware solutions for organizing and completing coursework, studying, note-taking, giving in-class presentations, and collaborating with other students. Introduction to online classes and learning resources such as podcasts and blogs. This course may also be offered online. This course may be taken three times.

Computer Information Systems A141 – Flash Programming

F 08

3.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 3.0 Lec/1.0 Lab; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading: student option. Introduces students to the fundamental concepts of the Adobe Flash environment and ActionScript programming. Topics include animation techniques, vector graphics, use of sound, and scripting fundamentals. Upon completion of the course students will be able to create tutorials and design games delivered on CD ROM and Web technologies.

Dance A142 – Folk Dance

F 08 . 5-2.0 units

Semester length; hours: .25-1.0 Lecture/.75-3.0 Non-lecture; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading: student option.

Emphasis on the knowledge of folk dance and the background which shapes the origins, themes and style of the dance. Fundamental elements of dance, rhythms and information about the link between dance and its cultural background. One particular culture will be focused on each semester. Topics may include folk dances from South America, North America, Europe, the Middle East and Asia. This course may be taken four times.

Dance A151 – Pilates as a Profession

F 08 1.0 units

Semester length; hours: 1.0 Lecture; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading: student option. For students planning a career in Pilates, including Pilates-related career options, and resumes, contracts, fees, insurance and other aspects of Pilates as a business.

<u>Diagnostic Medical Sonography A123 – Sectional Anatomy for Medical Imaging</u>

F 08 4.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 3.0 Lec/3.0 Lab; prerequisite: Biology A221; fee: none; grading: graded. This is a study of specific areas of the human body in serial sections. Designed for diagnostic medical sonography and Radiologic imaging technology. Emphasis is on structures observable on diagnostic medical sonography, computerized tomography and related imaging studies.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography A126 – OB/GYN Sonography

08 3.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 3.0 Lec/1.0 Lab; prerequisite: DMS A123; fee: none; grading: graded. A cross-sectional anatomical and Sonographic study of the female reproductive system including the nongravid pelvis as well as the gravid pelvis; includes specific study of embryology, placenta, amniotic fluid and cord, breast and neonatal brain. Topics of discussion will include appropriate laboratory tests, ultrasound scan protocols of the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine (AIUM) and other imaging modalities utilized in OB/GYN.

Electronics Technology A101 – Robotics 1 Mechanics & Design

7 08 4.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 4.0 Lecture; corequisite: Electronics Technology A170, advisory: High School Physics, Math A047 or concurrent enrollment; fee: none; grading: graded. Design a robot to tournament specifications. Analyze, diagnose, modify, calibrate document the prototype. Project –based hands-on learning strategies focus on mechanical structures in robot design and function and the physical laws that govern design including but not limited to: braces, beams, brackets, motors, gears, wheels, transmitter, receiver, etc. This course may be taken two times.

Electronics Technology A289 – Internship

F 08 2.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 1.0 Lecture/4.0 Arranged; prerequisite: Electronics Technology A135 and A155, corequisite: Electronics Technology A170; fee: none: grading: student option. A supervised internship, as an assembler or technician, with scope of work related to classroom-based instruction previously completed. The student will research companies and prepare for internship interview. Course includes a directed study of the worksite environment, assigned duties, techniques and skills required for job performance. Student will complete objectives specified by the employer. This course may be taken four times.

Hospitality, Travel & Tourism A135 – Homeland Security

F 08

2.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 2.0 Lecture; advisory: Airline Travel Careers A116; fee: none; grading: graded. Introductory study of domestic and international threats of terrorism. Examines the concepts, definitions and contemporary issues of modern terrorism. Includes law enforcement issues for first-responders relating to terrorism, particularly with regard to Homeland Protection and counter terrorist measures. This course may also be offered online.

Hospitality, Travel & Tourism A269 – Destination Management

F 08

1.0 units

Semester Length; hours: 1.0 Lecture; prerequisite: none; fee: none: grading: graded. Get the most comprehensive guide to destination management. From tours to transportation, from entertainment to local rules of etiquette, the Destination Management Company (DMC) is the premier resource that utilizes the right venue, location, speaker, and vendor to ensure a highly professional and successful program. This course may also be offered online.

Hospitality, Travel & Tourism A290 – California Labor Law

F 08

3.0 units

Semester length; hours: 3.0 Lecture; prerequisite: none: fee: none; grading: graded. California labor and employment law including legislation, court cases and regulatory requirements. Organized to make complex laws understandable. Topics include Unemployment Insurance, State Disability, Family/Medical and Sick Leaves, Workers' Compensation, Training, Personnel Records, Privacy, Wage & Hour Laws, Compensation, Exempt/Non-Exempt. This course may also be offered online.

Photography A100 – Basic Digital Photography

F 08

2.0 units

Semester length; hours: 1.0 Lecture/3.0 Non-Lecture; prerequisite: none; fee: none; grading: student option. A basic course to familiarize students with the fundamentals of digital photography. Students will gain practical experience relating to different digital cameras, exposure, light, color, composition and presentation. This course may be taken four times.

Photography A126 – Digital Imaging with Photoshop

F 08 3.0

Semester Length; hours: 2.0 Lecture/3.0 Non-Lecture; prerequisite: none: fee: none: grading: student option. An introduction to digital imaging for photographers using Adobe Photoshop. Students will learn how to manipulate and enhance digitized images, including retouching for output to a variety of media. This course may be taken four times.

The Orange Coast College Chemistry Renovation/Expansion project will be funded with both State Capital Outlay and District funds. The College Facilities Selection Committee interviewed four firms for this project and has selected HMC Architects because of their extensive experience in designing science laboratories. If the Chemistry FPP is accepted by the State, the project would be funded in the 2013/14 budget year.

It is further recommended that the Chancellor or the Vice Chancellor of Administrative Services be authorized to sign the letter of proposal.

Public contract Code 20652 provides authority for the governing board of any community college district without advertising for bids, the use of other Public Agencies contract for lease or purchase of equipment when the Board has determined it to be in the best interest of the District.

On June 18, 2003, the Board approved the staff recommendation to set a District standard using Dell computer equipment. On June 25, 1997 the Board approved Apple Computer, Inc as a sole source supplier of Apple computers since Apple has limited distribution channels to educational institutions. This updated request is to continue the use of Dell as a standard. The procurement of these computers is a planned result of older model computers reaching end of warranty service. As noted previously, the procurement of Dell and Apple computers provides a higher level of service with the latest technology and a substantial cost saving for the District.

After review by Golden West College, Director of Purchasing, and the Vice Chancellor of Administrative Service, it is recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize the Director of Purchasing to issue a purchase order for two-hundred sixty-three (263) Dell and forty-five (45) Apple computers using the WSCA Master Agreement and Apple's Collegiate Purchase Program (CPP).

Fiscal Impact: \$450,000.00 (General Funds)
