Project Status: The site fencing has been removed and the walkways are open for pedestrian circulation through campus. While final "punchlist" activities are being completed, the building user groups continue the process of unpacking and moving into their new building. The campus will occupy the building for the Fall

semester and any adjustments/final completion items will be addressed during off-hours. Notices of Completion will be recommended for Board authorization in September.

Coastline College Newport Beach Learning Center

Architect: LPA Architecture Construction Manager: CW Driver DSA Approval (Phase II: Building Construction): May 2011 Est. Construction Start: August 2010 (Phase I: Site Preparation) Est. Completion: October 2012 Funding: Measure C General Obligation Bond

Project Status: Footing preparation and concrete pours are ongoing and will continue through the end of August. Currently, approximately 50% of building footings have been poured. On any given "pour day" you will find 50-60 concrete trucks on-site pouring 500-600 yards of concrete. While the footings are being completed, formwork is being constructed and erected in preparation of pouring the first floor walls.

Orange Coast College Classroom Refurbishment

Architect: Dougherty + Dougherty Architects Construction Manager: UCMI Construction Start: June 6, 2012 Scheduled Completion: August 15, 2012 Funding: Measure C General Obligation Bond

This project is in final completion stage. On August 15th, new furniture will be delivered/installed and the campus will begin moving back into the buildings. These rooms are continuously scheduled with classes during the upcoming semester, and the students will enjoy significantly lighter, refreshed, and technologically modernized classrooms.

Orange Coast College Athletic Support/Baseball Entry Complex

Architect: Stern Architects Construction Manager: Orange Coast College/District Construction Start: June 9, 2012 Scheduled Completion: November 6, 2012 Funding: Foundation & Measure C General Obligation Bond

The contractor remains on schedule for completion on 10/5/11 (better than one month ahead of the contracted completion date). The footings and slabs have been completed. On 8/9/11, the contractor begun constructing the exterior (masonry) walls of the building. It is anticipated that the walls will be completed by 8/30 at which time work will begin on the roof.

It is recommended that authorization be given to apply for the following funded programs and/or projects and to participate, if funded, as outlined below. It is further recommended that the Chancellor or Vice Chancellor of Administrative Services be authorized to sign any related documents as appropriate.

Coast Community College District has applied for the State Chancellor's Office, Career Technical Education (CTE) Transitions grant titled **"CTE Transitions"**. The emphasis of this allocation will be on facilitating the transition from secondary to post-secondary to occupation. The areas that will be funded within this grant are: outreach/career exploration; validation – not origination – of current articulation agreements (using templates and other existing resources); support for "credit by examination" mechanisms (testing & registrars); support for concurrent enrollment options (but not direct instructional costs); and support for coordination of work-based learning/internships/placement.

Fiscal Impact: If funded, Coast Community College District will receive \$140,910 from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. No matching funds are required.

Coast Community College District has been awarded funding for the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office SB70/SB1133 grant titled "Evaluation". This will be the fourth year of funding for this grant. The District Office in collaboration with WestEd and the Institute for Evidence Based Change (formerly CalPASS) will receive funding to develop a System-wide evaluation of the Career Technical Education/Economic and Workforce Development Pathways initiatives and a data matching project. The goal is to provide an in-depth review of how funded programs are working at the local level, their ongoing achievement of objectives and activities, and outcomes, and then inform interested stakeholders and policy makers of what is working, what areas need improvement, and recommend future funding needs. WestEd, through a subgrantee agreement with the District Office, will evaluate the impact of the SB70 initiative and those Career Technical Education/Economic and Workforce Development pathway grants funded through this initiative. Institute for Evidence Based Change, through a subgrantee agreement with the District Office, will research and conduct a data matching project which follows SB70/1133 students by industry sector/career pathway from high school to community college. All oversight of this grant and the subgrantee agreements will be handled through the District Educational Services department. (Previous Board Approval: April 6, 2011)

Fiscal Impact: Coast Community College District will receive \$1,600,000 between February 1, 2011, to and including January 31, 2012. No matching funds required. The 4th year of this grant has received an augmentation for \$100,000. The new grant total will be \$1,700,000.

Coastline Community College has applied for the California Community College, Chancellor's Office, Perkins Title IB grant titled **"Business Education Statewide Advisory Committee (BESAC)"**. Coastline Community College will serve as the 2011-2012 fiscal agent and facilitating institution for the Business Education Statewide Advisory Committee (BESAC) to host advisory committee meetings and co-sponsor the annual conference.

Fiscal Impact: If funded, Coastline Community College will receive \$38,000 from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. No matching funds are required.

Orange Coast College has applied for the California Community College, Chancellor's Office, Perkins Title IB grant titled "Career Development State Advisory Committee". Orange Coast College will serve as the 2011-2012 fiscal agent and facilitating institution for the Career Development Statewide Advisory Committee. Activities will include: meeting coordination, professional development workshops, distribution of literature, web site maintenance, and implementation of marketing plan.

Fiscal Impact: If funded, Orange Coast College will receive \$38,000 from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. No matching funds are required.

Approve Non-Standard Agreement between Children's Home Society and the Coast Community College District for the Purpose of Obtaining Funding for Childcare at the Orange Coast College Harry and Grace Steele Children's Center beginning August 18, 2011 for Eligible Student Parents

Background: The Orange Coast College Harry and Grace Steele Children's Center currently funds childcare for low income student parents through funding from contracts with the California Department of Education-Child Development Division (CDE-CDD). However, our grants (contracts) will be reduced through state cuts by 11% for the 2011-2012 year. The previous 2010-2011 year Cal WORKS Child Care funding was completely cut and 18 student parent spaces were eliminated. The Children's Center is now looking for other funding sources to restore spaces and ensure that we can continue our primary mission to serve as many student parents as possible. Access to child care is a critical component in academic success for these student parents. After meeting with the representative from the Children's Home Society of California it was brought to our attention that it is possible to move approximately 20 families currently on our (CDE-CDD) grant who receive CaiWORKS benefits over to Children's Home Society funding for the fall semester. This would open up spaces for new student families in need that are currently on our waiting list so that they will be able to receive childcare in order to take classes. Without the opportunity to accept funding from Children's Home Society, we will not be able to open any child care spaces for subsidized students in the Fall Semester. Our waitlist currently holds 95 OCC students waiting for subsidized childcare services. (See Attachment # 7)

Goal/Purpose: To continue providing quality childcare and expand other revenue sources that will support adding more student parent spaces to better serve this declining population and meet our primary mission of serving students.

Comments: Submitted to Risk Services on July 13, 2011

Recommendation Statement: After review by the College President and District General Counsel, it is recommended by the Chancellor that the Board approves the Agreement between Children's Home Society and Coast Community College District for the purpose of providing child care funding at Orange Coast College Harry and Grace Steele Children's Center for eligible students. The Board President, or designee, is authorized to sign the Agreement and any related documents, indicating approval by the Board of Trustees.

Fiscal Impact: Children's Home Society currently reimburses childcare funding at the Regional Market Rate which is higher than that of our contract grants from the California Department of Education Child Development Division. The Regional Market Rate will currently cover the daily rate that we charge our full-cost families in our Infant, Toddler, and Preschool Programs. In our Young Preschool Program which serves children 2-3 years of age, the Children's Center will be reimbursed at a daily rate which is \$5.14 less than the fee we charge our full-cost families. By the third working day after the end of the month, the Children's Center will submit the prior month's sign-in sheets for each funded child to the Children's Home Society office. Children's Home Society will send reimbursement payment for the prior month's childcare

services within twenty (20) working days from when they are received. This reimbursement will be a Children's Center revenue source for operating funds and will not incur any negative fiscal impact through this contract.

During the Spring of 2009, the Board of Trustees and the Chancellor assigned the task of preparing and presenting hiring Policies for Board consideration and adoption to the Chancellor's Hiring Policy Task Force. Additionally, the Task Force was given the charge of developing hiring procedures to be consistent with Board adopted Policy.

Discussions of the Hiring Policy Task Force, relating to the draft CCCD Management Recruitment and Selection Procedures, resulted in procedural recommendations that have Policy implications. It is the recommendation of General Counsel that items with significant Policy implications also be addressed in Policy, following review and discussion by the Board of Trustees. Based on Counsel's instruction, the Policy Task Force is recommending the following revisions to the existing Management Hiring Policy. Specifically, the Task Force unanimously recommends the following:

- A complaint procedure to provide search or selection committee members the opportunity to report process infractions and seek remedy.
- A specific statement guaranteeing an employee who accepts an interim assignment the right to resume his/her permanent position when the assignment is complete; but if there was a need to reorganize in a manner that eliminated the position, the employee would be guaranteed the right to return to a comparable position with equal pay.

Further, there is a stated interest by some in modifying the existing Policy and Procedures to preclude those serving in interim management positions from being considered for the permanent position. The Task Force did not reach consensus on this interest and have agreed that this matter needs to be resolved through Board Policy discussion in Chancellor's Cabinet and the Board of Trustees.

During the August 3, 2011 Regular Meeting of the Board, it was determined that the matter relating to selecting interim managers for the permanent position should be referred to Presidents' Council to formalize a recommendation for Board consideration.

It is the recommendation of the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources that the Board adopt the unanimous Policy recommendations of the Task Force. It is also recommended that the Board receive the requested input from a representative of the Presidents' Council in order to make a determination or provide additional direction to staff on the matter relating to precluding managers serving in an interim capacity from being considered for the permanent position. During the 2010 academic year, a subcommittee of the Hiring Policy Task Force created a draft Management Recruitment and Selection Procedure that was reviewed and revised by the full Task Force and vetted through District constituency groups - faculty, classified staff, confidential employees, and management. The draft Procedures apply to the search and selection of educational managers (such as Vice Presidents and Deans), classified managers, managers serving in an Acting capacity, and those serving as Interim Managers.

Constituent feedback, as well as recommendations from the Board's General Counsel, Chancellor's Cabinet, and the Board's Personnel Committee have resulted in meaningful changes to the Procedures, which are attached to each Trustee's Agenda. During the August 3, 2011 Regular Meeting of the Board, the Procedures were presented by a representative of the Task Force and discussed by the Board.

In accordance with Board Policy 2410, it is the recommendation of the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources that the Board ratify the CCCD Management Recruitment and Selection Procedures upon a finding of consistency with Board Policy. (See Attachment # 22)
