At this time, the District desired to issue its third series of bonds under Measure M in an amount not-to-exceed \$30,000,000 (the "Bonds"). The Bonds were being authorized for sale for the purpose of providing funds to finance projects approved by Measure M and to pay the costs of issuing the Bonds.

On a motion by Trustee Prinsky, seconded by Trustee Grant, the Board voted to authorize the District to purchase hardware, maintenance and services related to the second phase of the Enterprise Wireless and Enterprise WAN projects, having determined that these arrangements were in the District's best interest. The Board President or designee, was authorized to sign any related documents, indicating approval by the Board of Trustees.

Public Contract Code 20652 provides authority for the Board of Trustees of any community college district without advertising for bids, the use of other Public Agencies' contract for lease or purchase of equipment when the Board of Trustees has determined it to be in the best interest of the District. At the May 18, 2016 meeting of the Board of Trustees, the Board approved the procurement of \$600,000 of 2015-16 Mandate Reimbursement Funds for cabling and hardware required for the completion of phase one of the Enterprise Wireless and WAN Projects. The current wireless infrastructure was not only unable to meet the present need but also unable to accommodate the future 21st century instructional growth and the collaboration between instructors and students. Chiefly the movement towards Bringing Your Own Device (BYOD) in a classroom environment.

The Enterprise Wireless and Enterprise WAN project would expand the wireless coverage to areas that meet the current and future instructional and administrative needs of faculty, staff and students, district-wide. This project would also increase accessibility and reliability in the instructional areas that rely on wireless technologies as a pedagogy as well as expand the capacity and increase performance by three fold. A reduction in the duplication and complexity of the current infrastructure would improve the network manageability, scalability, reliability, and security risk which would significantly simplify the experience of the students, faculty and staff.

A total of 10 vendors were solicited for the Enterprise Wireless and Enterprise WAN project. The roll out of these projects would allow the Coast Community College District to implement current and future wireless initiatives that are directly related to the enhancement of student learning and skill development. In addition, the required infrastructure equipment to implement the Enterprise Wireless and WAN projects would modernize and expand the existing equipment used for direct support of instruction. The majority of work was required to be completed over the summer duration for Orange Coast College and Golden West College prior to the deluge of students for the fall semester 2016. The Wireless procurement was broken into three phases to accommodate the deliverable date of fall semester 2016.

Phase 1 procurement of \$600,000 was approved by the Board of Trustee on May 18, 2016. The distribution of funds was delineated as:

- Teraband/ACS apportion of \$304,315 is allocated to implement the wireless cabling for OCC.
- ePlus apportion of \$295,685 is allocated for the Cisco Wireless hardware for OCC.

Phase 2 procurement of \$588,000 is being requested by the Board of Trustee on June 15, 2016. The distribution of funds is delineated as:

- Teraband/ACS apportion of \$93,066 will be allocated to complete OCC wireless cabling and to start the implementation of GWC wireless cabling.
- ePlus apportion of \$494,934 will be allocated to complete the OCC wireless project and to start the implementation of GWC wireless hardware.

Phase 3 procurement of \$2,487,924 will include the approval of the remainder of the associated costs at the July 13, 2016 Board Meeting.

- Teraband/ACS apportion \$382,962 of will be allocated to complete the wireless cabling project at GWC, CCC and the District
- ePlus apportion \$1,176,559 of will be allocated to the procurement of the remaining Cisco wireless hardware for GWC, CCC and the District
- Altware apportion (\$758,428.52) will be allocated for the procurement of the District-Wide Firewall and the Wireless management appliance
- Trace3 apportion (\$169,974.88) of will be allocated to support the F5 Load Balancer
