2.01 Public Hearing before the Board of Trustees of Coast Community College District Pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code Regarding the Plan of Finance, Significant Public Benefits, and Projects to be Constructed with Proceeds of California Community College Financing Authority College Housing Revenue Bonds

Board President Hornbuckle opened the Public Hearing at 5:10 p.m.

Dr. Andy Dunn, Vice Chancellor of Finance and Administrative Services introduced members of the student housing project team who presented the staff report and responded to trustee questions relative to project management and process oversight. A resolution would be presented at the August 1, 2018 meeting to advance the project.

The California Community College Financing Authority (the "Authority"), a joint powers authority created by certain community college districts, planned to issue tax-exempt bonds (the "Bonds") to finance the acquisition, construction, furnishing and equipping of an approximately 811-bed college rental housing project and surface parking (the "Housing Facility") to be located on the campus of Orange Coast College (the "College"), as well as the construction of tennis courts, surface parking and other College related projects to be located on such campus (the "Additional Project" and together with the Housing Facility, the "Project"). The Housing Facility was owned by NCCD—Orange

Coast Properties LLC, a California limited liability company (the "Borrower"), whose sole member was National Campus and Community Development Corporation, a nonprofit corporation as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

As a member of the Authority, Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 required a public hearing to be conducted, followed by the approval by the Board of such financing prior to the Bonds being issued by the Authority.

There were no public comments.

The Public Hearing was closed at 5:27 p.m.

2.02 Public Hearing before the Board of Trustees of Coast Community College District Pursuant to the California Government Code Regarding the Plan of Finance, Significant Public Benefits, and Projects to be Constructed with Proceeds of California Community College Financing Authority College Housing Revenue Bonds

Board President Hornbuckle opened the Public Hearing at 5:28 p.m.

The California Community College Financing Authority (the "Authority"), a joint powers authority created by certain community college districts, planned to issue tax-exempt bonds (the "Bonds") to finance the acquisition, construction, furnishing and equipping of an approximately 811-bed college rental housing project and surface parking (the "Housing Facility") to be located on the campus of Orange Coast College (the "College"), as well as the construction of tennis courts, surface parking and other College related projects to be located on such campus (the "Additional Project" and together with the Housing Facility, the "Project"). The Housing Facility was owned by NCCD—Orange Coast Properties LLC, a California limited liability company (the "Borrower"), whose sole member was National Campus and Community Development Corporation, a nonprofit corporation as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Section 6586.5 of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Code") required a public hearing by the Board as a member of the Authority to consider information concerning the proposed issuance by the Authority of the Bonds to finance the public capital improvements described above and the significant public benefit of such financing in accordance with the criteria specified in Section 6586 of the Code.

Trustee Moreno indicated that there were findings of significant public benefit by providing reasonable housing for students attending community college. A resolution would be presented at the August 1, 2018 meeting to advance the project.

There were no public comments.

The Public Hearing was closed at 5:30 p.m.

2.03 Public Hearing before the Board of Trustees of Coast Community College District Regarding Award of Standard Energy Services Contract (ESCO) Pursuant to California Government Code Section 4217.12(a) and Approval of Standard Energy Services Contract with SmartWatt Energy, Inc for Energy Efficiency Improvements; Orange Coast College Lighting Energy Project; RFP 2129

Board President Hornbuckle opened the Public Hearing at 5:31 p.m.

Dr. Andy Dunn, Vice Chancellor of Finance and Administrative Services provided a brief staff report.

Orange Coast College was seeking services to replace all existing lighting fixtures within the Maintenance & Operations building, the Welding Center, the Skill Center, the Electrical Sub Stations (5), and the Campus Walkway Post Tops with an energy efficient lighting solution. The campus sought to reduce energy consumption, utilizing the funding made available by California's Proposition 39 Energy Efficiency Program.

This project was approved by the State Chancellor's Office and allocated funding by the Proposition 39 energy efficiency funds. Government Code sections 4217.10 through 4217.18 authorized public agencies, including community college districts and school districts to develop energy conservation, cogeneration and alternate energy supply source agreements without competitive bidding. Districts entered into energy service contracts based on terms and conditions which the governing board determined was "in the best interest of the district," provided that such determination was made at a regularly scheduled public hearing in which public notice was given at least two weeks in advance pursuant to Government Code Section 4217.12 (a).

Specifically, under GC 4217.12 the Board found that "the anticipated marginal cost to the District for conservation services provided under the agreement were less than the anticipated cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of these purchases." Sections 26235(c) of the *Public Resources Code* provided added requirements for the administration of Proposition 39 funds. One such requirement was the prohibition of "sole source" contracting to award Prop 39 funds.

It further stated that the District may use "best value criteria" related to price, features, function, and life cycle costs in awarding said funds. Consistent with this requirement, the District issued RFP 2129, on June 2, 2018 and June 8, 2018 seeking qualified Energy Service Companies (ESCOs) to provide services related to "The Lighting Energy Project" at Orange Coast College. 354 vendors were notified via the PlanetBids Portal and fifteen vendors attended the mandatory job walk on June 11, 2018. Three responses were submitted and evaluated by campus energy management staff and the campus Maintenance and Operations Director.

Public Notice was given on July 5, 2018 in the Times Daily Pilot pursuant to Government Code Section 4217.12 (a).

Golden West College sought consulting and engineering services to study, document, and develop a solution to remedy the observed sinking and/or settlement of the bookstore on the Golden West College campus. 20.01 CCC - Non-Standard Agreement with SEIU-United Healthcare Workers-West and Joint Employer Education Fund

At their June 20, 2018 meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the Non-Standard Office Plan Purchase Agreement with RingCentral, Inc. for the modernization of the telephony systems to a Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) telephony infrastructure. In addition to a five year service contract, the non-standard agreement approved the utilization of RingCentral's professional services to oversee the project through completion, ultimately moving the Coast District towards a unified communications system.

The RingCentral Professional Services Statement of Work, pursuant of the non-standard office plan purchase agreement, procured project management services during the VoIP implementation, the development of the necessary planning & design documents, an assessment of the current network's readiness, the build-out of the user interface, the deployment of the new VoIP devices, telephone number porting, and training.
