Golden West College sought contractor services to remove all tile and plaster to allow for replastering and new tile to be installed in the Golden West Pool.

Notices were published in the Daily Pilot on July 21, 2022 and July 27, 2022. Additionally, notices were sent out to 153 vendors utilizing the Planet Bids portal. An onsite job walk was conducted on August 2, 2022 and two bids were received and opened on August 11, 2022.

### 21.11 DIS - Bid Tabulations and Award of Contract for Contractor Services for the Orange Coast College Chemistry Building; Bid No. 2170

On a motion by Trustee Parker, seconded by Trustee Moreno, the Board voted to award the Standard Contractor Services Agreements for Bid No. 2170 to the lowest responsive and responsible bidders for Bid Packages 1-22, contingent upon state approval, and authorized the Board President or designee to sign all documents indicating approval by the Board.

As part of the Vision 2020 Facilities Master Plan, and after being awarded partial State funding for the project, Orange Coast College sought to construct a new 43,786 square foot, two-story Chemistry Building. The project was procured via multiple prime trade contractors with C.W. Driver acting as the District's construction manager. The project would commence on October 20, 2022 and be completed by April 30, 2024.

Notices were published in the Daily Pilot on January 12, 2022 and January 19, 2022 notifying potential bidders of the prequalification opportunity. In addition, notices of this prequalification were sent to 1349 potential bidders via the direct bid notification system through the PlanetBids portal. One hundred Fifty prequalification applications were received, of which 107 bidders were deemed prequalified. Seventy-Three bids were received and opened on August 1, 2019.

Upon completing the review of the bids, low bidders were identified, and the verification process initiated. As part of the verification process, C.W. Driver reviewed the scope of work of the two lowest bidders in each package and conducted interviews with the apparent low bidder to validate the understanding and accuracy of each bid. After bids were submitted, two apparent low bidders, Fischer, Inc and Empyrean Plumbing, discovered a clerical error and respectfully requested to withdraw their bid in accordance with Public Contract Code Section 5101(b).
