- a. Golden West College (Rick Hicks) The attendance and sales continued to go up. A \$5 per space increase was in discussions for July 1, 2025. Everything was going smoothly.
- b. Orange Coast College (Rich Pagel) Everything was going well. There would be possible improvements to the parking lot barriers, with installation of removable barriers that could be removed during the week and installed for the weekends. A cost proposal for the purchase of removable barriers would be available from the vendor in 30 days and proposals would be provided for both colleges. The operations manual for the swap meet was updated.
