HABITAT MAINTENANCE



A morning spent outdoors in nature is

exhilarating and fun. If you can join us on a regular basis, you may find your place in maintaining the habitat and trails. We are on the grounds with our volunteers Monday thru Fridays, 9:00 a.m. through noon. We will provide training for pruning, planting, and irrigation of California native plants. We will require a day and time commitment from our volunteers. Please call ahead to sign-up at (714) 842-4772. NURSERY

The Shipley Nursery Volunteers propagate native plants from cuttings, tend the plants for sale and help with plant sales. Seeking individuals interested in learning about propagation and general care of California Native plants, weeding. If you have knowledge of California Native plants currently and like to share your talents and information, you are very welcome. Currently the volunteer days are 9am - 11 am on Tuesdays and

Fridays. Additional hours and days will be added in the future. They also help maintain the native plant and butterfly gardens across from the stream. The major native plant sale is held the last Saturday in September and kicks off the winter planting season for natives. Plants are available for sale throughout the year with sales being a major source of funds for Shipley Nature Center.

COMPOSTING

Volunteers manage the Compost Center and may be found at work most Friday mornings from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.. They also assist with seminars typically held on Saturdays four times per year.

VISITOR SERVICES

Are you a cheerful person willing to greet visitors? Can you count the number of visitors, relay any activities happening that day, answer common questions, and hand out trail guides and scavenger hunts? Visitor service volunteers are stationed at the front of the park at our welcome table, under shade umbrellas and with provided seating. We will train any volunteers and provide a Q+A guide for common questions that visitors ask. Currently part of the reason the park is not open more days of the week is because we require volunteers to staff the park when it is open. We prefer to have two volunteers at a time to greet and assist visitors during park hours, for safety and maintenance concerns. For consistency, we

prefer volunteers to commit to at least one specific day a month for four hours, though two hours is also acceptable. Consistent days help us plan out if we'll be able to open more days in the future. We are currently only open Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, from 9 am to 1 pm.

KIDS ACTIVITY LEADERS

Lead activities for kids of all ages, Crafts, reading a book, playing an interactive game, explore the trails, talks about composting in general, worm composting and much more. We will train.
